Chimney works



The upper chimney of Troopers Hill is now covered in scaffolding. Many thanks to Bristol City Council for carrying out this final stage of four years maintenance work on our upper and lower chimneys. Both are Grade II listed structures and a valuable part of Bristol's industrial heritage. Initial estimates suggest

the work should take two weeks to complete.

Photographic survey
