

## St George Green Space Investment Plan Survey - Results

Which statements do you most agree with (pick THREE)	Votes at Forum & by email
1. Concentrate spending on St George Park first - it is the most important green space in St George.	27%
2. The priority should be the natural green space along the River Avon (Troopers Hill, Crews Hole Woodland, Conham Vale and River Avon Trail).	16%
3. Spending should be spread throughout St George equally.	65%
4. Most important are the smaller green spaces that have been neglected in the past.	16%
5. Smaller lower cost improvements should be done first so that results can be seen more quickly.	22%
6. Most important is creating and signing walking routes to link spaces throughout St George.	0%
7. Spending on new and improved play areas is the most important thing to do first.	33%
8. We need to spend money on facilities for teenagers before anything else.	22%
9. Priority should be to give older people or those with less mobility give them somewhere pleasant to sit and relax.	11%
10. Wildlife issues, woodland management etc. should be first priority.	38%
11. Prioritise work to entrances to all spaces to make them more welcoming.	5%
12. Get the basics right first - dog waste and litter bins, a few benches.	22%
13. We need to prioritise a large high impact project to show that we are achieving something.	22%
