SEAT SAYS THANK YOU

The vandalised bench on the top of the Hill has been repaired after well wishers donated nearly £400 to put it right. So much money was given in fact that there is cash to spare and this will be used to help erect seats in other places on the hillside. The bench which has recently penning its own thank you notes has been temporarily repaired wooden slats but a more permanent repair in metal will follow in due course. Sadly plate metal which commemorated the life of Phyllis Gay (nee Roby) whose bequest paid for the original bench will not be going back as her daughter fears its eventual loss if the vandals return.

PIED PIPER ON THE HILL

August 13th will perhaps not be remembered for providing the best weather of this summer but nonetheless it might be recalled as the afternoon the Hill came alive with a trail of youngsters following a story teller around the Hill. Maudsley came to tell a story using the Hill and the children's own ideas for inspiration as part of the laid amusements for Family Fun Picnic that afternoon. A small crowd of about 30 children and their accompanying adults came to have a picnic and watch the expected mass ascent of balloons from Ashton Court early that evening. Colouring, quizzes and tasty snacks provided by the Friends kept the youngsters amused when they were not pursuing Martin across the Hill.

POSH NEW SIGNS

Those of you who walk across the Hill regularly will remember the old signs at the Greendown and Malvern Road entrances. Rob Acton-Campbell (one of the Friends) has designed a new sign which will be going up in various places on the Hill soon. The signs will tell people a little bit about the Hill, ask them to clear up after their dogs and to take care on the steep paths. There will also be a place to put up signs about the various events on the Hill and meetings which the Friends organise from time to time. The signs are being paid for with the grant money which the Friends were given for this year from the Lottery.

STOPPING BIKERS!

At the Summerhill Road entrance to the Malvern Road open space a new fence and gateway has been built by the Council. This is because the bollards were not working to keep motorbikes off the field. The fence has a RADAR gate which can be used by wheelchair users to get onto the field.

Next on the list of urgently needed improvements is a new gateway at the Malvern Road entrance. Thoughts are also being given to a rustic gate onto the Hill from the Open Space but first money needs to be found to pay for it!

PLAYGROUND PROBLEMS

The Friends of Troopers Hill would like to see something done about the vandalised swings and slide on the Malvern Road Open Space but are uncertain about what to do for the best. It seems a great shame that local children do not have access to decent play equipment. But on the other hand Council

efforts to upgrade the playground in the past seem to have amused the vandals as much as the local children. Would it be best to take away this playground altogether? Might a wildflower meadow and a few trees be a better use of this space at this end of the field?
