A very warm and extremely humid day was followed by very similar conditions at night with the temperature remaining close to 20°C. These ideal conditions were only slightly hampered by a slight breeze and a rather large moon. Three MV traps were operated by RB (x1), JM (x1) and SO (x1) from 21.45 until 12.30. This was the first time that the site had ever been trapped and consequently nearly all records are new. The site has an interesting mix of habitat with heather, bell heather, broom and gorse with grassland and scrub.

An interesting species list emphasising the importance of this site for grassland, heathland and birch scrub/woodland. The considerable numbers of the Shears, Shoulder-striped Wainscot and the Heart and Club reflected the grassland community. The single Burnet Companion had presumably been disturbed from a roost in the grass as it is a day flying species.

Batia lambdella is a specialist feeder associated with gorse (a species noted on the 2005 field meetings list as worth seeking in such habitat). B. lambdella was recorded at this site in 2000 by Dave Gibbs but is the only known site in the region at present. Small Elephant Hawk is more a species of heathy habitat than its commoner and larger cousin the Elephant Hawk.

Caloptilia populetorum is a first record for the region. It is a local species across southern England and as a larva feeds on birch. Cochylis nana is very local in the region and confined to a few birch woodland sites. Epinotia bilunana is another fairly local birch feeding species. The most interesting macro-moth of the night was probably the Red-necked Footman which occurs locally across the region in woodland and occasionally appears as a migrant. The larvae feed on lichens growing on deciduous trees.
